Bradfield St Clare Parish Council 8th August 2019-08-16

The Chairman welcomed Council members and one member of the public.

Proposed Speed Limit:

The current update is that the decision report is with Mark Stevens and Councillor Mary Evans for signing off. The Highways team will then prepare plans and send them to Operations and once this is through their checks, they will order the works to be carried out. The estimated time for the signs to be in place is towards the end of this year.

Broadband:

Following the site meetings, OpenReach is now working towards a solution for those at the junction of Bury Road and Bradfield St George Road who do not have access to Superfast Broadband.

Overgrown Trees:

The Parish Council continues to attempt to find out if Suffolk Highways Department or Anglia Water owns the land which houses the water pumping station. Concern has been expressed about the proximity of the branches to the nearby houses.

Car Parks:

People who use the car parks will be asked their views about parking enforcement. An online version of the questionnaire can be found at: www.smartsurvey.co.uk/s/WestSuffolkParking

West Suffolk Council has been under pressure to introduce 'pay on exit' car parking. A trial will be conducted at the St Andrews Street car park.

Bus Services:

Suffolk County Council is proposing cuts to rural bus services.

Council Tax Refund Scam:

The Council will NEVER ask for bank details to pay a refund – be aware of the scam that is targeting residents.

Footpath Issues:

A local resident has reported the almost impossible and dangerous state of the footpath parallel to St Clare Hall.

There is a padlocked gate across the Elm Green path that goes through from Elm Green Road to the Felsham to Cockfield Road. The Rights of Way Officer at Suffolk County Council will be contacted about both these issues.



Bradfield Weather



'August rain: the best of summer gone, and the new fall not yet born. The odd uneven time.' - Sylvia Plath

As suggested in the last report the latter days of July were very warm, including the highest temperature ever recorded in the country of 38.7C, not too far away in Cambridge on Thursday, 25th. As so often happens the heat brought several thunderstorms, only one of which produced any significant amount of rain. Total fall for the month was 34mm against our average of 53.6mm.

August has so far been **rather** unsettled with yellow weather warnings for wind and rain which did not actually come to much. There have been a couple of days of material rainfall which contribute to the to date figure of 25.5 mm against our average of 64.3mm for August, this being our wettest month of the year on average.

It was a case of déjà vu! We've had the speaker Colin Wilkinson before but never mind, it is such a wonderful idea. The Jubilee Sailing Trust was set up to give disabled people of any age, gender or severity of disability, the chance to sail a three-masted schooner. The first to be adapted was the Lord Nelson (formerly the Charlotte Rose of TV fame) but due to public demand a brand new ship was commissioned and built entirely of wood. It cost £14,000,000 to build with no government grant and is named The Tenacious. They sail all over the world with 6 paid crew, 50% disabled paired with 50% 'buddies'. There is no age bar; the oldest having been 87 and the youngest 14. They enter the Tall Ships Race every year and sail all the year round. Places are not free but heavily subsidised. News from Homefield




Just over 6 weeks ago but too late to be included in the July Grapevine, we managed to double our sheep flock. I was woken by Ben dog, who needed to go out at about 5.00am and Lucy was as quiet as usual with no signs of lambing. However, when I went out at 6.00am there was this little black 'sack' of lamb already trying to stand up to find her mum's teat for milk. It's Lucy's first lamb and she'd obviously been attending to the pre-natal classes knowing exactly how to lead Lola to the teat and licking her dry at the same time. It doesn't matter how many times I see a birth it is still magical. Jump forward 6 weeks and Lola has now changed form a lamb in a sack to a little barrel of legs and is causing more than a little trouble. Most evenings we let the chickens out of their run and they wander across the field foraging, returning to their house when it gets dark. Lucy and Lola have a fenced off area of the field, fenced with 3 strands of electric wire connected to a fully charged fencer battery. The little Lola who at first respected the fence has now learnt if she runs fast at the lower wire she can 'pop' out without getting a shock. She then heads straight for the chickens to play with them. We end up with Lucy going up and down the electric fence because her baby has left her. Lola is bouncing around chasing the chickens back into their run. She then runs back up to see her mum, the chickens pop out of their hut with an 'all clear' at which point Lola returns! It's a very good game and very amusing unless you are a chicken, so she is now fenced in with an electric net fence and I have hidden my ladders hopefully she will soon learn. Please don't answer any adverts from somebody needing a second hand trampoline.

By the time you read this 2 more heifers will have moved to Suffolk Cheeses. Belinda and Button are both due to calve in the first week of September so will go off soon to learn the system before calving. In the 'allotment' we have now lifted the Charlotte, Pentland Javelin and Maris Peer potatoes, all having been sown to see what will grow not adhering to any plans. Yields have been average but flavour brilliant and so far no slugs. Courgettes, carrots and lettuce have done well but dwarf and runner beans, spring onions and beetroot have been poor. It might be due to my lack of plan, poor weather

conditions, bird damage etc., etc., but it is still fun and can be very rewarding. I now play darts blindfolded, if I'm as good at spiking potatoes under the ground when lifting them, I could soon make myself a new career at the OCHE!
