Ahead of the meeting the Clerk ensured all present had received the necessary paperwork relating to income and expenditure for 2020 and 2021. All items were approved.

News From Homefield





It has taken a long time to start writing this month, what has happened? Was it this month or the end of last month? Am I repeating myself or is it all 'fake news'? To help I looked back at last year's Grapevine for July. This contained the silage harvest. Last year all looked well until the 'baling day' when it poured with rain all day and a lot of those silage bales are still on the field edge, as everybody seemed to make plenty so the demand was very low. This year's grass crop looked terrible, all the grasses running to seed and no rain to swell the sward. There was no quantity of rain forecast and after last year's experience I plumped for a 'bird in the hand is worth two in the bush' attitude. The contractors came in and cut the grass the next day then rolled it up and baled all in glorious sunshine. Totting up came in with just under half the number of bales compared to last year off the same acreage. The quality is better and maybe with a good rain we can get a second cut – apologies to the arable farmers who probably don't need the rain at the moment but I am trying to get it personalised over grass fields only!

My four cows are still munching around on their 'no milk holiday' and they do enjoy a chat with passers by. It provides me with a bovine 'fix' but does make me remember there used to be 45-50 cows out in that same field - how times have changed.

The three sheep remain quite cool literally, they have a tin shelter, which gives them a little shade during the sunny days but due to the pecking order they don't all fit in comfortably so I moved the electric fence to the field headland so they had trees for shade. Next day I was expecting a box of Roses chocolates on the doorstep to say thank you but no, they still prefer their tin shed or better still lying flat out in the middle of the field panting away in the midday sun. When you walk out to the middle of the field (maybe to see how hot it is – as you do) there is a cooling breeze going straight over them and they are very comfortable – thank you! I was going to write now about how much we can learn from animals but have just looked up to see three sheep lying in the shade of the trees around the paddock, so please disregard the above writings, I think I've been 'played' but will look on the doorstep tomorrow morning.

The allotment is beginning to yield now and I've lifted the first early potatoes for use now. The variety Rocket was low yielding this year compared to the last but Sharpes Express was better. I was a bit disappointed with the yields but it was a very cloddy seedbed and it is not that many weeks ago that the frost blackened every leaf and stem and you think how can they recover from that? Beetroot, dwarf beans (SQUEAKY BEANS) and carrots are going well with the odd cucumber and courgette thrown in. The cabbage white butterflies have even allowed me half a cabbage, if I don't mind peeling off the outer holey leaves. The soft fruit also did well in the hot dry conditions over the last month. Strawberries, blackcurrants, raspberries and gooseberries, all in their first year, did very well. Reading back over the last bit I started to think, yes I am a 'gardener', and then I thought about the pak-choi seedlings bought a few months ago. I put 3 into a pot of compost for Kate and the same for Megan in compost in my allotment. Several weeks passed and both girls posted pictures of their pak-choi meals. My seedlings did nothing for weeks then ran straight up to seed and died - so my gardening badge will have to wait a while; still waiting for the Roses as well.
