Dear Friends

Church Warden's Report





Harnessing the atmosphere with bacteria!

With such a dry February, the opportunity for early spring drilling and fertiliser applications was too good an opportunity to miss! And good job we didn't miss it as March has been a write off for land work and spraying with several healthy doses of rain!

All the winter crops had come through the drier winter well and rooted deeply, the land was firm and dry, so we applied the first dose of nitrogen to the wheat and barley in very good time this year, barely leaving a footprint behind the tractor. The 2nd year grass silage was also suitable to travel, and seedbed nitrogen was also applied ahead of drilling spring oats and barley.

So, we made a great start and all crops have responded to early Nitrogen fertiliser and are looking very green and standing up tall now rather than flat to the ground. As part of a trials project this year, we are looking at a development bacteria product called Blue N, it is a foliar applied Nitrogen fixing bacteria that once colonised in the crop can fix up to 30kg/ha of Nitrogen from the atmosphere straight into the leaf of the growing plant. The Bacteria is present in all plant species on the planet but generally in very low populations; and feeds off methylene that the plant releases as a waste gas. So, it's a natural symbiotic relationship between plant and bacteria, where the plant feeds bacteria methylene and the bacteria feeds the plant with Ammonia converted directly from the Nitrogen gas that is all around us. The Earth's atmosphere is 78% Nitrogen and 21% Oxygen so this is a very sustainable source of Nitrogen we can access to feed our crops and we hope this product will become part of our reduced N fertiliser strategy for the future.

The young bullocks are growing well in our second batch of store cattle that arrived on the farm last autumn, making similar daily gains as the first cohort last winter and so we've maintained the same ration for building frame indoors before they get turned out to graze the herbal leys again this spring. That's if the pigeons don't graze all the clover out there first!

As a group they came to us heavier this Autumn and so we hope turn-out weights will be nearly 400kg/head with the potential to finish some animals straight out of the fields next autumn. This would reduce next winter workload and mouths to feed daily.

On the ever-growing spring job list is wheat growth regulator and micro-nutrition; Blue N applications; silage grass broad-leaf weed control; new grass ley seeding, sugar beet planting; Countryside Stewardship topping and reseeding; cattle weighing; cattle turnout and paperwork! So, when the weather does break it will be all hands-on-deck for the foreseeable as we prepare our crops and animals for the summer months of harvest and grazing.

Easy Easter Biscuits

Ingredients

300g plain flour, plus extra for dusting150g golden granulated sugar150g salted butter chopped1 large egg2 tsp vanilla extract or vanilla bean paste

STEP 1

Weigh the flour and sugar in a bowl. Add the butter and rub together with your fingertips until the mixture resembles wet sand, with no buttery lumps. Beat the egg with the vanilla, then add to the bowl. Mix briefly with a cutlery knife to combine, then use your hands to knead the dough together – try not to overwork the dough, or the biscuits will be tough. Shape into a disc, then wrap in cling film and chill for at least 15 mins. Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Line two baking sheets with baking parchment.

STEP 2

Dust a work surface with flour. Halve the dough, then roll one half out to the thickness of a £1 coin. Use an egg-shaped cookie cutter (you could also make a cardboard template to cut around) to stamp out as many cookies as you can, then transfer them to one of the baking sheets, leaving a little space between the biscuits. Repeat with the other half of the dough.

STEP 3

Bake for 12-15 mins, until the biscuits are pale gold. Cool on the sheets for 10 mins, then transfer to a wire rack to cool fully. Once cool, decorate to your liking. *Will keep in an airtight container for up to five days.*
