#### BRADFIELD ST CLARE WEATHER

I finished last month's report with a promise of 16C to come at the end of February. This duly arrived with the final few days of the month being very frosty to start, before turning into unbroken sunshine and high temperatures for the time of year. Rainfall recorded was 38mm against our average of 45.7mm.

Regrettably the sun deserted us - how much better one feels when the sun shines in these stay at home times. March has been very unsettled with several days of very high winds, the odd day of sunshine and some very heavy showers with hail included. On one day, in the high winds, the showers came almost horizontally and I wondered how much actually got caught in the gauge? This shows to date 32mm, compared to our average of 37.2mm.

March 20th is the Spring equinox, clocks go forward next weekend, snowdrops and daffodils everywhere – Spring has arrived astronomically – let's hope someone tells the weather gods.

#### **APRIL**

"April weather, rain and sunshine both together"

"When April blows his horn 'Tis good for both hay and corn"

I love this quote by Mark Twain ... "The first of April is the day we remember what we are the other 364 days of the year"

I love the spring and as I write this (21st March) the first signs are beginning to appear. There are sweet violets (white and purple) growing around the moat, primroses in the churchyard and I have seen the first cowslip on the footpath beside St Clare Hall. When we married 44 years ago and moved into our new home in Bradfield St Clare I couldn't believe how lucky we were and I still feel the same all these years later. At that time on warm nights in May, with our bedroom window open, we would fall asleep to the sound of the nightingales singing in Hedge Wood, only to be rudely awaked at first light by the cuckoo. He would keep on all day, every day until the middle of June when he suddenly went cuck cuck cuck followed by a cough and a splutter as if he could no longer remember the words. Sadly there have been no nightingales in Hedge Wood for many years and if I am lucky enough to hear the cuckoo he is some way off. Although the cuckoo is a parasitic bird, cruelly invading the nest of unsuspecting birds such as dunnock or robin, I can't help admiring how clever they are. How can a young cuckoo, raised by foster parents, know that they have throw out all the other eggs in their nest and to migrate to Africa in July? One of the mysteries of nature I guess. It's not all bad news however as the green woodpecker who was once rarely seen is now a common sight with his beautiful bright red head, dipping his beak into our lawn for ants. Also the spotted woodpecker can be heard in early spring hammering his beak on old tree trunks to let everyone know he's there. One of the marvels over recent years here has been the sight of buzzards circling ever higher. On many occasions I have witnessed them being driven away by two or three crows when they fly too close to their territories. So, although nothing much seems to have changed in Bradfield St Clare, in fact the wildlife tells a different story. I do hope that one day we shall once again hear nightingales and cuckoos in Bradfield St Clare. Until then I shall enjoy listening to the mewing of the buzzards and the mocking laughter of the green woodpecker as he dips and dives. This rhyme by an unknown author tells us all we need to know about the cuckoo.

He sings his song in May
In June he changes tune
In July he flies away."

#### Easter Biscuits

This recipe comes from the 'Good Housekeeping Picture Cookery Book. My edition is 1953 and was given to me by my godmother when I got engaged that year. A very long time ago! There are some very interesting old adverts - Electrolux Fridge, Foster Clarke jellies and a G.E.C. cooker for £35! -Pat Hipwell

30z butter
30z caster sugar
1 egg yolk
1/20z chopped mixed peel (optional)
10z currants
1/4 tsp mixed spice (I think I add more)
60z flour
Pinch of salt
(I usually make double quantity)

- Cream butter and sugar together, beat in egg yolk
- Add peel, fruit and flour and mix to a stiff dough (adding a little milk if necessary).
- Roll out on a floured board prick all over with a fork and cut into rounds with a cutter.
- Bake on a lightly greased tray (or non stick baking sheet) in a moderate oven (160 degrees/fan oven) for approximately 20 minutes, until they are lightly coloured.
- Dust with caster sugar.
