The latter part of April continued to be dry, with no further rain beyond that noted last month, leaving it at 10mm for the month against our average of 36mm. There have in fact been a number of Aprils over the years with single figure rainfall.

It was after a break of four weeks that the rain finally came in the early days of May and what a change that made. With it being warm as well, leaves and blossom appeared and verges quickly sprouted seemingly overnight. At the time of starting this, we had had just 12.5mm plus the odd unmeasurable shower, not nearly enough for farmers and gardeners, but whilst a threatened thunderstorm promised overnight did not come to close there was 7mm of rain. An unsettled, but still warm period is now forecast and if the rain, as yesterday, could come during the night maybe we can all be happy! Rainfall to the 19th of May is now 19.5mm compared to our average of 50.4mm.

News from Homefield

Lambing started at Homefield on April 8th, with my usual spot on prediction (well, a week early actually!). The first ewe to lamb was Egg, her twin sister is called Chicken as we're not sure who was born first, she lambed on her own and had one male and one female, both healthy and looking for the teat within minutes. Next, was Lola who had one ewe and one ram lamb followed closely by Lucy with two ram lambs. Yet again it amazes me how these little lambs know where life giving colostrum is to be found, the word instinct doesn't seem to cover the whole process. Then there is the ewe with its maternal instinct, gentle bleats and nudges getting the lambs circulation going and encouraging them to get mobile. All was going so well, apart from the ram to ewe ratio, I won't be doubling the flock this year. Then we came to Treacle's birthdate and after a very difficult labour, well into the night she delivered two of the tiniest lambs I have ever seen, alive and suckling. Sadly, the middle lamb born was very large and was stillborn.

Early next morning, everything appeared normal, Treacle chewing and the lambs feeding. Sadly when we checked after breakfast (a gap of approximately half an hour) Treacle had died. We fed the two tiny lambs with special formula and bottles but we lost them a few hours later. I appreciate that there are two sides to keeping livestock but it doesn't stop you questioning yourself after an event like this. We have also had a case of blowfly strike, where the fly lays its eggs in the wool of the sheep (perfect warm and damp conditions) which hatch out as maggots and start burrowing into the skin. She, No 7, as she is known (we are very good with our names or very random) has been clipped and treated but it will take a while to recover. This will explain the bald rear end of one of our sheep.

We have a small sheep arc that I made initially for Lucy years ago and all the lambs love running up and over it, often pausing for a look around on the top 'I'm the King of the Castle' style. The other evening there were three lambs on top of the arc whilst Lucy was inside scratching her head on the tin, this in turn moved the arc across the field - our evenings entertainment!

Today we have had a good half day of rain (hence being early writing my piece - brownie points from the editor!) which should help the allotment where everything seems to have stood still in the dry conditions. Why is it you never hear anyone say "I'm well pleased with the weeds this year, must be doing something right" - GLYN
